
Christ Church Celebrates 175 Years

The first Episcopal services in Martinsville were held in July, 1841, by Dr. George Washington Dame of Danville at the home of Dr. Anderson Wade. This year we celebrate the 175th anniversary of that first service, the origin of our church. **Our 175th Anniversary Celebration Service will be held on All Saints Sunday, November 6th, 2016**. Projects are underway in preparation for the Celebration Service, and for the many special events during the months preceding that service.

Work has begun updating the timeline on the walls of the Undercroft. We have sixteen years to add to our history on eight feet of wall space. Take a look at the timeline as it stands today and notice the intertwining of world, local and church events for each decade. Which events of the past 16 years do you consider important enough to include? If you have photos, documents, or ideas, please give them to Marty Gardner, our chairman, or to committee members Sue Rosser, Melinda Penn and Jean Morris. If you're interested in the portrayal of our church history, please join us in making decisions about events to include.

- 3. Serving on committees;
- 4. Serving as a leader in Youth Group;
- 5. Serving at church activities such as Loaves & Fishes, mission trips;
- 6. Attendance in Sunday school and at church services
- **II. Service to school:** Conduct/behavior; Special academic achievements; Extracurricular activities; Leadership experience; Sportsmanship/athletics; Artistic expression
- III. Service to Community: Participation as a volunteer; Participation in organizations (Scouting, etc.); Participation in summer/part-time employment; Participation in local arts groups; Participation in civic groups.

RESURRECTION OF THE RECTORY

Easter VI 2016

The Search Committee eagerly awaits information from the Diocese on prospective candidates for our new rector and should have some in May, very soon.

Our Profile is on the National Church website and candidates are being vetted by Bishop Mark Bourlakas and Rev. Jonathan Harris before forwarded to the Search Committee.

We have made it known that we do have a rectory, and it is part of the "package" at Bishop Mark's suggestion. He has stated that this is becoming more attractive to prospective priests, with the change in the length of service in one place, as well as the housing market in many areas. The savings to Christ Church is estimated to be between \$12,000-\$15,000 annually in housing allowance and taxes. This is extremely important in these economic times.

Our new rector will have a beautiful, newly renovated home in a good neighborhood, in walking distance from many amenities and extraordinary convenience to work – housing that will not require search or purchase when the rector moves in and no sale or worries when he or she moves on.



Generous parishioners have given funds sufficient to install an updated electrical system, as well as an energy efficient gas heat pump and cooling systems replacing the boiler.

Debbie Lewis and Carol Deaton are coordinating the "extreme makeover". The kitchen is being totally remodeled as are the two and one half baths. The Landscaping Committee, under the leadership of Cari Zimmer, is working on a plan for beautification to the outside.
