Dear Members and Friends of Christ Church,

A couple of years ago, the Marvel show *WandaVision* reintroduced popular culture to the concept that 'grief is love persevering.' This idea names the truth that, just as God's love for creation never ends (1 Corinthians 13:8), our love for our friends or our things does not end simply because our friend has died or the house has been sold, and we mourn for what we have lost and will not see again in this world. For many of us, this season surfaces our grief as our love for Christmases past encounters the reality of Christmas present. The love of grandparents and parents who were central in our earliest Christmas memories lingers even though they no longer physically join us at the table. We still love the unbridled joy our children (and we ourselves) felt around the tree, even if we do not gather with anyone currently experiencing such joy. We grieve that we celebrate in different places or with different customs than what we loved before. On December 17, I will be joining Ryan and Faith (the Methodist colleagues with whom I facilitate Public Theology) for a Blue Christmas service, at which we can acknowledge our losses and lay our griefs before God in whom all our love perseveres. - Fr.
