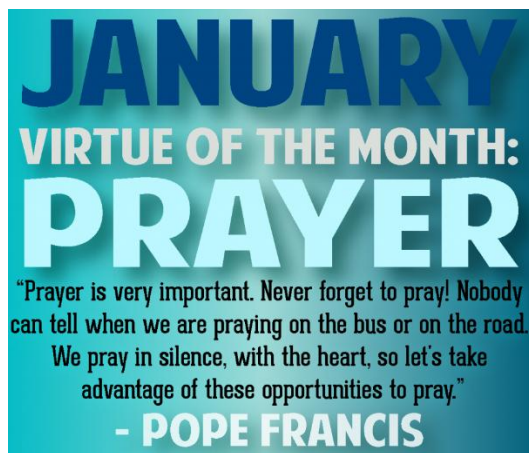

Dear members and friends of Christ Church,

The good Lord willing and the creek don't rise, on the last day of January the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia will elect our Seventh Bishop at our Convention in Roanoke. Our Search Committee has nominated a [slate of four strong candidates](#): The Rev. Paul Canady (Rector, Christ Church, New Bern, NC), The Rev. Karin MacPhail (Rector, St. Elizabeth's, Roanoke, VA), The Very Rev. Becky McDaniel (Rector, Westover Church, Charles City, VA), and The Rev. Grant Stokes (Rector, Trinity, Portsmouth, VA). They will be in the Diocese for a series of [meet-and-greets](#) the week of January 5; all members of the Diocese are invited to attend or watch online (each of the three evenings will be livestreamed and recorded for subsequent viewing).

I encourage each of you to get to know the candidates and pray for and about them through this process; if you hear the Holy Spirit calling you toward a particular candidate (or warning you against a particular candidate), please let me or our delegates (Rives Coleman and Jay Dickens) know so we can include your observations in our prayerful discernment. Although most of us only encounter a Bishop on their visit to Christ Church every year or two, the Bishop can significantly impact Christ Church in several ways. Their priorities for the staff and mission of the Diocese may directly benefit our members (such as the Canon for Evangelism working with the Vestry on the direction of the church, or the Diocesan Youth Ministry providing community and events for our teenagers). Their plans for Diocesan finances (including the Voluntary Proportionate Giving they ask of Diocesan churches) can directly impact our budget. Their liturgical leadership, preaching, and even personality can attract members to the churches and priests to the Diocese, or adversely impact them.

All of which is to say, even if you never make your way to the Bishop Search part of the Diocesan website, I ask you to pray for Jay, Rives, and me on January 31 as we vote. If all goes well, the new Bishop will be consecrated and begin work in June.

Kroger Grocery Card Program
