Dear members and friends of Christ Church,

In my first five months as your Rector, one of the things I have come to appreciate about Christ Church is the property we have to host and support our ministry. In particular, my thinking about the Parish House has evolved from asking why a church owns a historic mansion to being grateful for the ways that the mansion helps us serve others: as a comfortable space for those grieving after our funerals, as a relaxed setting for our Bible studies and meetings, as a welcoming venue for neighbors who might otherwise never approach Christ Church to gather for events, as an office space preferable to subdividing the Undercroft or sharing the Rectory, as a host for the Boys and Girls Club and the good work they do. Whatever I might think if we were talking about buying the mansion today, given that we already have it I cannot help but see our use of the Parish House as a good thing. That said, maintaining such a big and historic building is no small challenge, and the Vestry is presently wrestling with the question of spending large sums to address growing problems with the exterior or deferring maintenance that might, in time, compromise both the beauty and the utility of the space. I invite your prayers for us as we deliberate, and we will keep you posted if and when we vote to move forward with the project.

John, Pastor Daniel Guenther (of Smith Memorial United Methodist Church, Collinsville), or other guests. Public Theology is designed to be accessible and engaging both for those who regularly attend church and those who do not, and as such is a good opportunity to invite friends who might enjoy our Christian fellowship but might not be willing to try Sunday worship. Our next Public Theology will be July 13; the gathering begins at 6:00 pm and the discussion runs from 7:00 to around 8:00.

# **June Vestry Highlights**

At our meeting on June 15, the Vestry further discussed the need for exterior work on the Parish House (repairing wood rot and repainting, which should be done every 10-15 years) but voted against taking action before meeting again with the potential contractor. We decided to increase the ticket price for the Oyster Roast (which will be held November 4, 2022) to \$50 to help cover anticipated cost increases. A motion was passed for the Toms Bell Tower Fund to repay bell maintenance costs that were erroneously drawn from other funds.

### Grace Network's Back2School Event

At the start of each new school year, Grace Network provides new socks, shoes, and backpacks with school supplies to students who need them in Martinsville and Henry County. Volunteers are needed to help register students (on the morning of July 9 and evening of July 19), buy supplies and pack the bus (July 15-17), fill backpacks (August 2), and help with the event proper (August 6); prayers for the kids and the volunteers are also appreciated.
