Dear members and friends of Christ Church,

Despite June being the start of Summer, which is often the quieter season in the life of the church, there are a few important things going on to which I want to draw your attention.

First is that the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia's search for our next bishop is beginning in earnest, and the first step is one in which all active parishioners in the Diocese are invited and encouraged to participate. On June 7, the Search Committee is holding listening sessions in-person and over Zoom so that we may share our hopes and dreams for the future of the Diocese, discern what common challenges we face, and consider what qualities we seek in our next bishop. Subsequently, a survey will be made available so that even those unable to attend a listening session can contribute their thoughts, out of which the Search Committee will develop the Diocesan Profile which will be available to potential nominees later this summer. In addition to details of the listening sessions, this newsletter includes the timeline of the transition process as currently planned, and a prayer that we all are encouraged to incorporate in our daily prayers.

Second is that Christ Church is currently searching for a new Nursery Attendant. If you know of anyone with parenting, babysitting, or other childcare experience who might be interested in a Sunday morning gig, please put them in contact with the church office. Also, while we search, please be especially patient with and welcoming to our families with young children, as they may contribute unexpected elements to the joyful noise we raise unto the Lord every Sunday morning.

Third is that Summer is the time when Christ Church offers fellowship time after Sunday worship; between Pentecost (June 8) and August 24 (the Sunday before Labor Day weekend), we will offer light refreshments (lemonade or other cool beverages and cookies or other snacks) on the patio (to the left as you exit the church building, between the church and the rectory). As you attend services this summer, I encourage you to plan to stick around for 15-30 minutes afterwards so that you may renew your friendships at Christ Church and get to know less familiar neighbors in the pews.

Kings Grant Eucharist

Pentecost - June 8

The Feast of Pentecost is **June 8**, as we celebrate the birthday of the Church when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples. You are encouraged to wear red (symbolizing the Spirit's tongues of fire) and stick around for the first of our summer lemonades after the service.

Continuing a summer tradition, we will have fellowship time with lemonade and cookies on the patio (or in the undercroft if it's raining) after the 10:30 service **June 8 through August 24**; if you are willing to help bring beverages and treats or set up and clean up, please **sign up**.

Church History Class

Having spent ten sessions on the History of the Early Church over the past year, the monthly Church History class will offer a brief survey of **Medieval Church History** on **June 11 at 10:30 in the Undercroft**, before moving on to the History of the Reformation with particularly attention to the English Reformation.

Wednesday Eucharist

On Wednesdays, we celebrate Holy Eucharist at Noon in the Chapel (enter via the glass Undercroft door at the back of the church building). These brief (thirty minutes) spoken services commemorate the saint of the day from the Episcopal calendar of Lesser Feasts and Fasts and are perfect for those who want to attend a service but are unable to come Sunday mornings or who want an additional gathering for corporate prayer to help them through the week. As of now, we are planning to gather every Wednesday in June.

Public Theology

Public Theology meets on **Wednesday, June 11** at **Mountain Valley Brewing** (4220 Mountain Valley Rd, Axton); the future of Renewal Brewing is up in the air at present, and Ryan, Faith, Steve, and I will be meeting this month in the hope of figuring out a more consistent host for July and following. This month we will be discussing Forgiveness; we begin with socializing and pizza around **6:00**, with the discussion going from **7:00** to **8:00**.

Loaves & Fishes

Loaves & Fishes (our monthly free dinner, open to all) is on **June 25**, with dinner being served **from 5:00 to 6:00**. Nursery Attendant - Applicants Sought

The Nursery Attendant cares for children up to age 5 during worship services on Sunday mornings. Duties include initiating and supervising play and reading with children, providing physical care as directed by parents, and straightening up the nursery.

Qualifications include an outgoing, friendly personality for interacting with parents and children, experience in babysitting, parenting, or other forms of childcare, passing a background check (paid for by Christ Church), and becoming Safe Church certified (three hours training, time paid for by Christ Church).

Sunday morning services are at 10:30 and last approximately one hour. The Nursery Attendant is expected to be present from 10:00 am until Noon. The pay for each Sunday worked is \$50. The Nursery Attendant may be invited to work during services or programs at other times for the same \$25/hour rate.
