Dear members and friends of Christ Church,

As you read this, we are about to begin the season of Lent, a time of penitence and preparation when we who have joined the body of Christ in baptism reflect on our sins and seek to amend our lives in advance of our annual commemorations of Christ's passion and resurrection. For many, Lent entails making additional time for study and prayer, and we offer several opportunities to do so. Specifically for Lent, the churches of Martinsville are again coming together for lunch and devotion on Thursdays, and instead of our regular Monday night Bible study, we will have light suppers (organized by Vestry members) and a program of conversations in Christian ethics (which will begin by thinking about the goods we as Christians value in our daily lives and how we respond when those goods come into conflict with each other). Our Sunday morning Bible study continues in Jeremiah, whose mix of prophetic condemnation and personal lament seems particularly appropriate for the season, and our monthly History of the Early Church and Public Theology programs are ongoing. In addition to Sunday morning services, there will be two services on Ash Wednesday and our regular Wednesday Noon Eucharists. I hope that whatever you do to repent during Lent and prepare for Easter, you know that you are welcome and encouraged to join any or all of these studies and services as we together make this Lenten pilgrimage.

This takes the place of the usual Monday Bible Study, which will resume after Easter. **Supper begins at 6:00 pm, with the discussion concluding by 7:30.**

# **History of the Early Church**

Our next study in the History of the Early Church will take place on **March 12 at 10:30 in the Undercroft**, discussing Ambrose of Milan, Augustine of Hippo, and the evolving relationship between the Church and Empire in the late 4<sup>th</sup> and early 5<sup>th</sup> Centuries.

## **Wednesday Eucharist**

On Wednesdays, we celebrate Holy Eucharist at Noon in the Chapel (enter via the glass Undercroft door at the back of the church building). These brief (thirty minutes) spoken services commemorate the saint of the day from the Episcopal calendar of Lesser Feasts and Fasts and are perfect for those who want to attend a service but are unable to come on Sunday mornings or who want an additional gathering for corporate prayer to help them through the week. Our upcoming regular services will be on **March 12, 19, and 26; on March 5**, the Noon service will be in the church for Ash Wednesday, and on April 2 there will be no service due to the Diocesan clergy day in Salem.

# **Public Theology**

Public Theology meets on **Wednesday, March 12** at **Renewal Brewing in Uptown Martinsville** (32 Franklin St). This month, making up for our cancellation in February, Pastor Ryan invites us to come together for a conversation on the role of faith and speaking out in political affairs. 


### **Diocesan Transition**

In a letter sent February 19, Bishop Mark Bourlakas announced his resignation as Bishop of the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia (effective May 22) to serve as an Assistant Bishop (based in Falls Church) in the Diocese of Virginia beginning June 1. A more detailed timeline of the search and election process is expected in the coming weeks, including plans for the interim, in the meantime, we are grateful to Bishop Mark for his twelve years of service in our Diocese.

### **Church Tree**

Twice in recent years (in early 2022, at a cost of almost \$600, and again on January 29, resulting in the cancellation of that night's Loaves & Fishes), the water main supplying the church building has broken at the northeast corner of Church St. and Letcher Ct. This second time, it was abundantly clear that the source of the problem was tree roots interfering with the line. As a consequence, at our February meeting the Vestry reluctantly approved the cutting down of the tree (on the left as you face the front of the church). We do not know precisely when the work will be done, but wanted you to know that it is coming and the exterior of the church will soon look different.
