October is Pastor Appreciation Month

Dear Members and Friends of Christ Church,

Ever since Jesus told his followers to care for the sick, healing has been part of Christian ministry; in the contemporary church, while specially-trained professionals practice medical healing, our healing ministry consists primarily of praying for those who are afflicted, trusting that God's love can heal where human efforts fail. In the Episcopal Church, we sometimes make these prayers physical by laying hands on the afflicted and anointing them with oil, and from before my tenure as your Rector, Christ Church has on occasion offered such prayers in conjunction with our corporate services of Holy Eucharist.

Since May, when we resumed healing on the first Sunday of the month, we have deliberately made this a public service of healing: using a litany of healing as the prayers of the people, we involve the whole congregation in praying for those who are sick or injured in body, mind, or spirit. By incorporating the healing into the service of Holy Eucharist, we remind ourselves that caring for the sick by praying for them, if nothing else, is a duty of all Christians, and that laying on of hands and anointing with oil are part of the ministry of the church and available to all.

Coming forward to receive special healing prayers is not necessarily a sign that one is sick or hurt. Being touched by other hands as someone else prays for you is sometimes the desired medicine for troubles unrelated to physical health. There is a further tradition of praying for healing by proxy: when someone who is present on a Sunday is praying particularly for someone who is absent, it is appropriate to lay hands on and anoint with oil the one who is present while both parties pray for the one who is absent.

All of this is to invite you, on the first Sunday of each month, to join in praying the litany of healing and to come to the altar rail as you feel called to particularly seek prayers for yourself or for someone you love. In Christ's love, John

#### **Chalices on Sundays**

In September, Bishop Mark issued a new directive to the clergy and parishes of the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia, instructing us to return to our pre-pandemic norms for the distribution of communion. Because our Sunday morning mask-wearing habits indicate that we are generally comfortable worshiping as we did before 2020, we will be eliminating the option to receive the wine in individual cups in compliance with our Bishop's direction.

Beginning on October 9, the wine will be offered only in chalices, one of which will be designated for intinction (dipping the wafer into the wine) so that we are not sipping from the same cup in which people have dipped their fingers.

For those who are concerned, sharing a common cup in church carries a very low risk of disease transmission because of the combination of the antiseptic property of alcohol, the oligodynamic effect (the biocidal property by which contact with metals kills microbial life) of silver, and the physical wiping of the interior and exterior lips of the chalice with clean linen after each sip. Intincting carries a higher risk (more akin to shaking hands during the peace) because any bacterial or viral transmissions that occur when fingers touch the wine won't be

mitigated by the silver or linen. The Bishop also reminds us that choosing not to receive the wine at all is perfectly valid because receiving the bread alone is still full communion.

In the wake of a significant interior leak on Labor Day and the subsequent discovery that the roof shingles were overdue for replacement, our intrepid Junior Warden, Andy Williams, is collecting bids for the roof work and the Vestry has voted to delay the previously announced replacement of the lift to next year after the roof is repaired. \$19,200 has already been received or pledged toward the Parish House work, and additional gifts would be greatly appreciated.
