

Dear members and friends of Christ Church,

In an effort to stave off potentially alarming rumors, I would like to take this opportunity to outline the financial situation that the Vestry is presently addressing. Like all churches (and similar institutions), the balance of the bank account for our general operations ebbs and flows based on fluctuations in giving and spending (for example, we know that our weekly giving is generally low through the summer months and very high around Easter, the Oyster Roast, and Christmas). When I arrived in 2022, the balance was quite large (around \$100,000) and the Vestry intended to draw it down over several years of deficit budgets (hoping that, before the surplus was expended, giving would increase such that we could balance the budget without slashing expenses).

Unfortunately, the gaps between budget and actual resulted in spending that surplus faster than anticipated, a trend exacerbated this year when we voted to replace two broken air handlers (totaling around \$20,000) immediately using that money rather than leaving the church sanctuary or Boys and Girls Club offices without air conditioning while we raised funds. Coupled with the summer ebb in giving, our account has briefly dipped to the point where we are concerned about our cash flow (we prefer to end each week with a balance above \$10,000 because some weeks we expend more than that on payroll and other bills while bringing in less than \$2,000).

To address the immediate cash flow issue, the Vestry transferred money from our Memorial Fund (in which unrestricted gifts in memory of those who have died are kept and over which the Vestry ultimately has authority) to cover payroll, pension bills, and a repair without which the sanctuary wouldn't have heat. At our meetings over the next few months, we will be considering broader solutions to balance the 2025 budget, and potentially rebuild the reserve in the account, to prevent future cash flow concerns.

Contrary to rumor, we have not bounced a check or missed a payment and, between the transfer and the expected increase in Fall giving, are in no immediate risk of doing so. However, I invite your prayers for the Vestry in the coming months as we balance two discussions: the next steps of the discernment process, reflecting on the conversations we have had and listening for the Spirit's guidance, and, informed by that discernment, make potentially difficult choices about our finances.

Following a summer hiatus, the Monday night Bible study resumes our discussion of the Gospel of Luke on **September 9**, picking up at Luke 8:22 with Jesus stilling a storm and casting out a legion of demons. We meet from 7:00 to 8:00 pm in the Parish House, and all are welcome.

Public Theology

Public Theology meets on **Wednesday, September 11**, at Mountain Valley Brewing (4220 Mountain Valley Rd, Axton). We begin with socializing and food around 6:00, with the discussion going from 7:00 to 8:00.

Trustees

Virginia law is unusual insofar as, instead of churches holding real estate in their own name, they have trustees appointed by court order. These are limited purpose agents of the Vestry, which remains the fiduciary authority (in trust for the Diocese), but the trustees must sign any real estate transactions when authorized by the Vestry and/or Diocese. For Christ Church in recent years, the trustees' only responsibility has been to sign the lease with Boys & Girls Club after it has been approved by the Vestry. The Diocese is trying to shift churches from the older model (under which a trustee, once appointed, served until their death) to five-year terms (to reduce the possibility of scenarios where a trustee moves away without being replaced or continues as a trustee when their long-term health calls into question their fitness as a signatory). In accordance with this, in August the Vestry appointed Rives Coleman, Jay Dickens, and Pete Scouras to serve as trustees through the end of 2029. They replace Hank Long, Trippi Penn, and Beth Sibbick, each of whom has served for at least eight years. We are grateful to them, and to John Swezey for serving as our counsel to file the necessary petition with the court.

Sunday Volunteers

Many folks are involved in making our Sunday morning services happen, and we would gratefully incorporate folks who aren't currently involved but want to be or who want to be involved more. The Choir and Altar Guild would always appreciate more voices and hands, and we could use more Ushers, Chalicers, and Readers to reduce the number of times we have to schedule those who are currently helping with our Sunday worship. If you are interested in serving in any of those capacities, please talk with Fr. John or someone who is currently involved in those ministries. Of particular interest as the number of available teenagers continues to dwindle are Acolytes; adults who are able and willing to bear the cross in procession, handle plates during the offertory, and otherwise help Fr. John during the service are encouraged to contact him.
